JOSH Dogs

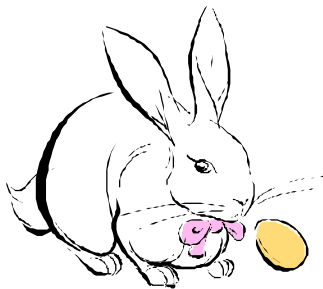
Joe Shine brought 3 cases of dogs for the surgery department. A picture will be taken soon for the newspaper. "Thanks", Joe and the American Legion.
